(Audio failure) as depicted -- there we qo; it's back -- as depicted on Exhibit A. And if you looked at the Exhibit A, I just took one of the excerpt pages out of the MOSH presentation, which does have the actual

physical dimensions of the parcel size on it. The second thing that the resolution does is it indicates -- again, it delegates to the CEO the authority to work with MOSH to move that museum parcel slightly. So it has some parameters and guidelines around that. It's still two-and-a-half acres, but it could move closer to Bay Street, it could be slightly narrower, it could be slightly wider, et cetera.

12 balance spreadsheet.

Was the board provided a copy of the large 13 14 size budget balance --

So we'll make sure you have one of those to look at, but they're handed out at that meeting. They're emailed to you.

We look at that to see what balance is 18 19 available in various programs. So if we have a 20 large, accumulated balance -- for example,

21 facade grants has a relatively large balance

and it's only being used in small increments. 22 23 That would not be something we would

24 prioritize. On the other hand, if there's a

particular account where we have pledged or

\$750,000 range. We only had a balance of 450-9

10 or something in there. So in the budget we put

11 250- in. We might have had 500- and we put

12 250- in. But we want to make sure we've got

enough in there you could do one loan. 13 14

And then -- so that's the first tier of the analysis. 15

16 And then I would say the second approach 17 is, then we go to the Years table that's in our

18 plan and we look at the prioritized

19 implementation of the programs in the plan and

whether we have allocated to date as much 20

21 funding as we hope to in the Years table. So

22 if any one of those projects is short and that

23 we were unable to put as much in as we had

envisioned, that would be the next priority, 24

I will say two cautionary notes that are in the auditor's report. One is, on the administrative budget, they point out the value of obligations that have been incurred that will require future appropriation. Primarily these are for historic building renovations. And they occur over the next two to five years, as those projects are completed, but they pointed out in the discussion of our budget --perhaps suggesting that we should be funding those in some way; however, they exceed the

value of our budget.

The one comment that I would have on that is, in the past -- there is a separate fund called the Downtown Economic Development Fund, which historically the City funded on an annual basis. They have not funded it at all since 2019. There really has not been a need for them to fund it since our resources are sufficient for us to continue to do our work now in the CRAs.

So we have not advocated for or asked for funding into the Economic Development Fund. And, in fact, these particular projects that

are being funded by the General Fund totally

supplant the need to put things -- I mean, it -- it's a tradeoff, right? And you could put that money in the Economic Development Fund and make us prioritize within it. Instead, we are allowing City Council to prioritize when they vote on the individual projects.

So I don't think that's going to be an issue, but I'm telling you it's in their commentary on our budget.

The other thing that is a comment that will come up on our budget is in the Northbank where we have the excess proceeds from the Lynch payoff that is projected. So we talked about this during our budget process. There's about \$4 million net revenue to the CRA as a result of the money coming in, paying off the balloon payment, and then our obligation to pay off the underlying self-insurance fund loan.

It may be suggested that that be put in reserve or put in the Economic Development Fund or some other action be taken with that. I don't know. It doesn't -- there's not a recommendation at the moment.

That's our budget.

1 Works budget, which is the following week, the

2 Public Works budget includes enhanced funding

3 for downtown maintenance on an operational

4 basis. So I think from DIA's perspective,

8 We're appreciative that the mayor included that

because one of the changes we've had is the

level of maintenance of sidewalks and treewells and other things downtown.

They provided a staff person -- Mr. Famy is here -- who has been working on inventorying that and assessing those problems, but in this year's budget he'll actually have funding available to make improvements or make changes when he sees that they're needed. So we're appreciative and supportive of that.

From a staffing perspective, we receive -in the budget, there's a recommendation that we
receive one additional position. That is the
property disposition and procurement manager
combined. So we had asked for two for those,
and it was given to us as one, combined, in the
budget.

We also asked for an administrative assistant position, which we did not get.

We are interviewing right now for the
first two positions, which are the strategic
initiatives coordinator and the parking

garages and how we are going to, you know,increase use of those, revenue, et cetera.

And then strategic initiatives are all of these various programs that have been approved in the plan and funded and that are not necessarily underwriting of incentives. So we've got to have someone else working on those. So we're interviewing on those right now.

As far as the City CIP, big news on that. I'm sure you've read about it in the paper. Downtown projects are receiving, in the mayor's proposed budget, \$125 million of additional or new funding in the CIP this year.

If you have the opportunity, express your appreciation to the mayor's office and the administration for that. It's a big help to our work. And, again, welcome your support

with council members or even attending the CIP 2 committee meeting before City Council if you 3 feel so inclined.

I've advised several downtown developers they may want to do the same thing because it's important for the Council to know that we don't just take it for granted, that this is really important to us and we want to see this investment in downtown parks, downtown roads, et cetera.

In addition -- and that doesn't include -there's 40 million in addition to that going to the baseball grounds, the performance center, the convention center, the Ritz Theatre. So this is just the first 125- as bulkheads, parks, Riverwalk, two-way conversions, those kinds of things.

All of the major riverfront parks, the bulkhead improvement on the North- and Southbank and the Riverwalk extensions are included, some are future phases of funding. So this kind of goes to Mr. Barakat's guestion about Riverfront Plaza.

Downtown lighting. A small number, but downtown lighting made it in the budget this

year, which allows us to implement recommendations of the study we did a year and a half ago, I think.

So we have a lighting study that 4 recommends some places that are too dark that need additional streetlights. Now we have the capital funding to do that.

Two-way conversion of Julia and the Monroe Street Road Diet are included. And the timing is coordinated with private development of adjacent sites.

So from a DIA standpoint, the CIP is a huge success and a huge complement to the work we're doing. By far, the not only largest dollar value investment, but the most coordinated effort with our plans and with the private development that's associated, so -something that we're very pleased to have.

Programming. As far as downtown programming, we found this year that we were not able to use all the funds that had been previously budgeted. We were directed to work with the Parks Department on implementation. They simply didn't have the bandwidth to implement the kind of programming we wanted to

see on the Riverwalk and adjacent parks. There 2 is now going to be -- next year, I believe -an employee on loan that the duPont Fund has

7 We are going to create a -- for the 8 engineers in the room -- an MOT. Point being, a time frame that shows what parts of the 9 10 Riverwalk are going to be open when and what are not. So if you think about, for example, 11 we're just finishing the FIS construction, and the Riverwalk will be open up to One Riverside, 13 14 and then we're about to tear up the Riverwalk for the construction of McCoy's Creek, so you 15 won't be able to cross McCoy's Creek, but you 16 17 will now have the Times-Union bulkhead --Riverwalk open again because we'll finish it 18 19 there.

So I think there's a real sequencing effort that needs to go on where we figure out what parts will be open, how we provide access to them, and how we activate the parts that are because the whole construction process will be a little painful for a couple of years as

That, at least we're very hopeful, is going to get done. We want it to be done because we can't process the agreements. Mr. Sawyer can't draft the agreements. We can't get them approved by City Council. We can't get them a final blessing, get anything signed until we can nail down a term sheet that they're in agreement with. So that -- it's a step that has to happen to be able to move on.

AR Polar. This is the property on the other side of WJCT. We are working through land values, encroachments, and construction costs. We are hopeful to get that to the board in September as well, so ...

MPS, kind of a budget report on that. You saw it a little bit hidden in your resolutions. But when we did the settlement agreement back in February, we were projecting \$2 million a year net savings. The budget that we have submitted for next year, and the auditor's comments on it, indicate we are in excess of \$3 million a year net savings. So it was a painful process, took a lot of our time, but

USS Orleck, we had a meeting with them this morning. They would like to stay in their current location for a year or more while the park is being designed. They have indicated to us that they wanted to see changes. I mean, these are contractual obligations. If 9 10 you want to say "in jeopardy," I will think --

I am seeing council members express more 11

awareness of the order of magnitude as more and 12

more of these have come through and they're 13 14 accumulating. I think there's a sensitivity.

So it is possible that we'll see a --

either pushback on approval of new requests or 16

that we will see a request to modify the 17

program to perhaps make it -- whether the 18 percentage of funding available would go down; 19

20 don't know how that would actually shake out,

21 but I am seeing maybe an increasing reluctance.

We're getting more questions on projects than 22

23 we were initially.

So these particular ones are not in 24 jeopardy that have already been approved that

we have a contractual obligation on. I think the real issue is the appetite to continue with

the program at its current level and whether

there is a growing concern that maybe it's too 4 5

much.

6 I will say the task was, get these 7 derelict buildings moving. They've been

sitting derelict for years. Figure out what

needs to happen to make people be willing to 9

invest in them and get them back in service. 10

11 It's what Mr. Kelley and I spent a bunch of

12 time on, kind of end of COVID, trying to come

up with that program. Council was willing to 13

adopt that program. The mayor's office helped 14

us in the process, supported it. It's working, 15

right? We did exactly what we said, so ...

16 17 BOARD MEMBER CITRANO: It's my opinion --

you know, I -- and I know that when the first 18 couple of applications came in, there was a lot

19 of discussion amongst the board about the 20

21 dollar amount and the percentage of the total

project, and rightly so. It's -- but when you 22 23

do the analysis -- and I know Steve does -- and you solve for the economic gap that exists, I 24

25 don't how anybody could look at it and say that

3 And so what I would say to the City Council is, we had a program where a set of 4 5 incentives were not being used because they 6 weren't effective; they were modified. And so is there a time to look at 9 10 the -- the incentive itself to draw it down a little bit? Absolutely, but I don't think it's 11 12 today.

I think we still have a lot of work to do to get some of these buildings that are not in service back in service and then we can always come back and take a look at the incentive package and tweak it because, you know, just conceptually at that point that we put it in the market -- and less incentive is needed, and so I think --

21 I think that in the last two years that 22 incentive has done a great deal of -- it 23 created a great deal of success and momentum for our downtown, so I'd hate to see that get 24 tweaked or reduced or anything else.
