5 And I have to commend everyone on the 6 City Council, certainly Councilman Anderson,

7 who was certainly one of the first to sponsor

the -- put his name on it as the sponsor of the 8

9 bill; Council President Boyer there, giving

10 educated information equally as well with

regards to the actual project.

12 The entire Finance Committee as a whole 13 signed on as a sponsor for this particular bill 14 today, so we have to give them a lot of credit.

15 But I also -- a lot of thanks too, but I also

16 have to give credit to some people.

17 This could not have happened without a 18 partnership with Mayor Curry and his team.

Mr. Mousa and Mr. Weinstein have been there and 19

20 have been very supportive of what we're doing

21 on this particular project.

> We could not have done it without Mr. Sawyer working on this project to get the

23 24 actual agreement in place. And I'll talk to

25 you a little bit about some of the things that

we had to work on post February 1st. 1

> 2 And people say, well, you know, now it's

3 June. You approved this on February 1st. You

understand that this was a redevelopment 4

5 agreement that also wrapped in essentially

three different projects; the Barnett Bank 6

7 Building at 34.2 million; it wraps in the Laura

8 Street Trio project at 44.6 million; it wraps

9 in a garage with a master lease, and the garage

10 is 11.2 million. It's a whole \$90 million

11 project. Each one of them could have been

12 their own separate redevelopment agreement. So

13 we wrapped them all into three.

14 And, you know, we approved the land for 15 the garage going as fee simple. Well, in the 16 negotiations we ended up selling the land to 17 them for \$943,000 and will deposit that into

the Parking Enterprise Fund. We ended up 18 getting in negotiations a three-year Letter of

19 20 Credit to the City valued at \$900,000, in the

event that there's a default under the sublease 21

22 from the developer back to the City.

23 So you take the amount of money that we 24 put into the Parking Enterprise Fund with the 25 sale of the land, at 943-, and you get the

Letter of Credit of 900,000. You get 2 \$1.8 million just in case something were to 3 potentially go wrong.

4 And this, again, is negotiations back and forth because, you know, the developer needs to make sure he has an agreement that he can actually get financed. And so what we were proposing -- and we were hardball. We were tough. You know, we wanted cross-defaults on everything, but sometimes the lender won't allow that. But we've got to make sure we protect the City's investment. And that is certainly what we did.

So I have to thank Tom, Guy, Jim, Karen, Bob, the Department, we all worked on this particular agreement to get it to the place that it is.

So this upcoming Tuesday, it will go before full City Council to hopefully get a 20 full vote of support for this particular project. Not without, you know, some challenges with regards to maybe one partner in 23 the transaction having a dispute with -- a private dispute with someone else. We've had to work through that particular discussion

I'm telling the board right now, neither the City nor the Molasky Companies are a party to any of that particular private dispute. That will get worked out through the court

system. And I don't try to get into that none 6 7 whatsoever, because I am not a lawyer, number 8 one, but I know for a fact that the City is not

9 a party to it and Molasky's not a party to it.

10 So the private parties that are a party to the dispute will work it out one way or the other 11

12 through the court system or whatever.

13 So with having said just that,
