- MS. BOYER: And I'm deferring to 22
- 23 Mr. Parola on the allocations.
- 24 MR. PAROLA: Thank you, Madam Chair.
- Resolution 2022-12-04 accomplishes three 25

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things all interrelated to the developer and

the developer's property, which is going to be

- known as the Lofts at Cathedral. They are
- building a 120-unit apartment complex on that.
- Of those 120 units, 118 units do not require an
- allocation because they are converting their
- existing building square footage to those
- units. So they are requiring an allocation of
- two units. That's the first thing this 9

10 accomplishes, is it allocates two units to --

11 to the project.

The second thing it accomplishes is it 12 authorizes mobility fee credits per the 13

mobility fee credit process and incentive 14

program in our BID and CRA plan, with a value 15

of \$36,441. The value of that is well in 16

17 excess of what it would be to, you know, pay

for two units. 18

19 That value was derived because we are getting between 3 and 3-and-a-half feet of

20 21 additional sidewalk space on the north side of

22 their project where currently there are places

23 where it's questionable whether or not we meet

24 ADA requirements. They're there absorbing the

cost of construction for that expanded sidewalk

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area, and the value is reflected in that \$36,000 number.

3 The third thing that we're doing is

authorizing the sale of up to 1.68 credits of

stormwater credits pursuant to the process

outlined in our Ordinance Code, and the price 6

of which is very prescriptive. So they'll come 7

in during ten-set. They'll be assigned a value

of costs for those stormwater credits and 9

10 proceed that way.

11 And I'm here for any questions.

8 Moving on to item D, Resolution 12- --

2022-12-05, RiversEdge allocation. 9

10 I'm assuming Mr. Parola is taking that

11 lead as well.

12 MR. PAROLA: Thank you again, Madam Chair.

Resolution 2022-12-05 accomplishes four 13

things onto their project, formerly known as 14

The District, now as RiversEdge. 15

Just to give a little background, the former developers, of which the current

developer absorbed their allocation, 18

redevelopment agreement, et cetera, have 19

requested that we sort of shore up a few things 20

21 because some of the elements aren't relevant

22 anymore.

The first thing this does is it reconfirms

the previous allocation. It doesn't expand

25 their entitlements. It doesn't absolve them

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from any of the mobility fee obligations. It

just reconfirms an action that was taken a

number of years ago to get this project

4 forward.

5 The second thing it does is it expressly

6 allocates 125 marina slips. That's because in

the redevelopment agreement, in the allocation,

it said, when the marina slips are to come on

line, a separate action by the DIA board would 9

10 be required for that allocation. So it was

contemplated a number of years ago, and then 11

we're just following what's prescribed in the 12

redevelopment agreement. 13

Finally, the third thing it does is it 14

replaces an August 26th date with a July 12th 15

date. The reason is, in the original 16

allocation we, unfortunately, referenced a date 17

that didn't exist, so this is correcting a 18

scrivener error that's hung out for a while. 19

20 My apologies.

And the fourth thing it does is it removes

Section 5 in the allocation. The reason it 22

23 does that -- Section 5 of the allocation, if

24 you go in the background material, it says

that, hey, all the property owners have to be

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notified that this is subject to a development

order of a development of regional impact.

Well, the development of regional impact no

longer exists. The development order was

rescinded by Council action. So it's not only

superfluous, it's -- it's wrong. So we're 6

correcting that action. 7

> And those are the four actions per this resolution.

THE CHAIRWOMAN: Thank you.

Do we have a motion yet? We did not. So 11

14 BOARD MEMBER GILLAM: Move to approve 15 2022-12-05.

BOARD MEMBER GILLAM: I noted Mr. Parola

used the word "finally." I like that word. 24

2 BOARD MEMBER CITRANO: Just one question 3 for clarification.

4 On the second page of Exhibit A, there's a

chart that shows the development rights in each 5

6 phase. You're saying that was originally

approved sometime ago, so we're not changing 7

8 any of the --

9 MR. PAROLA: Through the Chair, you're exactly right. This was approved, let's call 10 it 2015. And so we're not expanding or 11 contracting, by way of example, any of the 12

development rights. 13

BOARD MEMBER CITRANO: Okay. Thank you.

resolution. So we can vote.

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14

1 Mr. Gibbs.

2 BOARD MEMBER GIBBS: Approve.

3 THE CHAIRWOMAN: Mr. Barakat.

BOARD MEMBER BARAKAT: Approve. 4

5 THE CHAIRWOMAN: Mr. Citrano.

6 BOARD MEMBER CITRANO: I'm in favor.

THE CHAIRWOMAN: Mr. Gillam. 7

8 BOARD MEMBER GILLAM: In favor.

THE CHAIRWOMAN: And Mr. Froats. 9

10 BOARD MEMBER FROATS: In favor.

11 THE CHAIRWOMAN: And I'm also in favor.

12

The resolution passes unanimously. 13

We're now on to item E, the AR Polar 14

access agreement. 15

Ms. Boyer. 16

17 MS. BOYER: Thank you, Madam Chair.

So as you will recall with access 18

agreements, if the recipient of the agreement 19

wants to perform any tests that include soil 20

21 disruption where they're actually invading the

22 soil and they have to replace it, then we bring

that to the board as opposed to doing it simply 23

as an administrative action. 24

25 In this case, we just approved the

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disposition resolution regarding AR Polar. And

what this access agreement does -- and it's

actually -- there are mutual access agreements.

We would be asking the board to provide an

agreement to AR Polar to allow them to

immediately go on to the City-owned property to

begin their soil testing and we will do the

8 same on their property. They will also provide

9 us one for their property.

10 So that is the essence of the access

agreement. 11

This is contemplating all -- a March 12 closing, so it's a fairly short window, and we 13

don't want to wait until after this is all 14

approved by Council agreements executed to 15

start the inspections and investigations. 16

THE CHAIRWOMAN: Excellent. Thank you.

Does anyone have a motion on 2022-12-08? 18

BOARD MEMBER GILLAM: Move to approve

20 2022-12-08.

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21 BOARD MEMBER CITRANO: Second.

THE CHAIRWOMAN: Thank you.

23 Are there any questions from the board?

24 BOARD MEMBERS: (No response.)

25 THE CHAIRWOMAN: If not, we'll move to a

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16

1 vote.

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Mr. Gibbs. 2

3 BOARD MEMBER GIBBS: Approve.

THE CHAIRWOMAN: Mr. Barakat. 4

BOARD MEMBER BARAKAT: Approve.

6 THE CHAIRWOMAN: Mr. Citrano.

BOARD MEMBER CITRANO: I'm in favor. 7

8 THE CHAIRWOMAN: Mr. Gillam.

BOARD MEMBER GILLAM: I'm in favor, but I 9

just want to make sure because the 10

11 resolution -- to make it clear, we'll have

access to their work product as we normally 12

would, correct? 13

14 MS. BOYER: I'm going to defer to

Mr. Sawyer because he drafts all of these 15

agreements, so he can tell you what the normal 16

17 language contains.

MR. SAWYER: John Sawyer, Office of

19 General Counsel.

That's more or less a standard provision 20

21 on the agreements, so we have access to any of 22 those records.

23 BOARD MEMBER GILLAM: I'm in favor.

THE CHAIRWOMAN: Mr. Froats. 24

25 BOARD MEMBER FROATS: In favor.

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THE CHAIRWOMAN: And I'm also in favor. 1 2 So Resolution 2022-12-08 passes

3 unanimously.

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4 We're now at a very important resolution, 5 2022-12-06, Mr. Todd Froats.

MS. BOYER: Thank you, Madam Chair.

Would you like me to read it or would you 7 8 prefer to read it?

THE CHAIRWOMAN: I'll let you read it.

10 MS. BOYER: Okay. So as you know, this is -- I mentioned earlier this is Mr. Froats 11

last meeting. We have certainly enjoyed having 12

him as a member of the board. And so, as 13 14

staff, we had presented to you a resolution

15 recognizing his service. And if I may read it 16

for the record:

"A resolution of the Downtown Investment Authority, DIA, in recognition and appreciation of Mr. Todd Froats for his dedication and service to the DIA board and his dedication and service to downtown, providing for an effective

"Whereas, Mr. Froats was appointed to the DIA board in 2018 and, whereas, throughout his tenure on the board Mr. Froats has been an

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active and engaged board member participating

in countless committee meetings and workshops.

"Whereas, during his tenure Mr. Froats was appointed and served as chairperson of the DIA

4 Budget and Finance Committee for three

6 consecutive terms.

"Whereas, Mr. Froats' experience as an 7 8 accounting and finance professional, as well as

his experience as a successful business owner 9

10 within downtown Jacksonville, have been

11 invaluable assets to the DIA in his fiduciary

12 responsibilities and in ensuring that economic

and redevelopment agreements have a net benefit 13

to the DIA, downtown, and the citizens of 14

Jacksonville. 15

> "Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Downtown Investment Authority.

"The Downtown Investment Authority recognizes and extends its sincere appreciation to Mr. Froats for his dedication and service to the Downtown Investment Authority and downtown."

This resolution, 2022-12-06, shall become effective on the date it is signed by the Chair of the board.

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Thank you. 1

2 THE CHAIRWOMAN: Thank you.

3 Do I have a motion to approve?

4 BOARD MEMBER GIBBS: So moved.

5 BOARD MEMBER BARAKAT: Second.

6 THE CHAIRWOMAN: I will open it up for comments from the board to Mr. Froats. 7

8 Mr. Gibbs.

9 BOARD MEMBER GIBBS: Todd, I had not 10 realized it was 2018 that you were appointed.

11 It seems like you were here almost as long as I

was, or have been. 12

13 You've been, as the resolution points out, a stalwart on this committee, and the citizens, 14 I'm sure. Thank you for the work that you've 15 done. We appreciate it. 16

THE CHAIRWOMAN: Mr. Barakat.

18 BOARD MEMBER BARAKAT: I'll echo those

19 comments. I think when Mr. Froats first

20 joined, his first year he was drinking from the

21 proverbial fire hose. There was a lot to learn

22 and to understand regarding DIA process and

23 City budgets, but many times I was thankful for

having his accounting brain in numerous Finance 24

Committee meetings and then every time we did

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our budgets and analyzed investment policy for the DIA.

3 So I appreciate his balancing out the fiduciary to the taxpayer, the betterment of

downtown with a pro business approach. That's

a balance that we all need, and kind of 6

discerning over the policies and resolutions 7

that are before us, and I think Mr. Froats did

a great job in helping us with that approach. 9

So thank you for your service.

11 BOARD MEMBER CITRANO: I think the very

12 first committee meeting I attended was the

Finance Committee, and it was over Zoom. And 13

14 it was just shockingly impressive to listen to

Mr. Froats and his knowledge of all the budgets 15

and every line item. It was really impressive. 16

17 Probably a little intimidating too as a new

board member, but that contribution to this 18

board can't be understated. And I'm sad that 19

you're leaving, but your effort and your tenure 20

is fantastic, and thank you very much. 21

THE CHAIRWOMAN: Mr. Gillam.

BOARD MEMBER GILLAM: I wasn't sure there 23

was going to be a motion and a second on this 24

one, but -- a couple of things. We were 25

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well-served by Ron Moody when he was on this 2 body. I referred to him, when he stepped off,

3 as a cheerleader for downtown. Probably second 4

only on the current board to Ron is you.

And I'll say -- I mean, it's a dichotomy because normally your number crunchers don't want to spend money and they're the kind of Eeyore to every project that comes along, and you played that role, you know, really well.

I think it's a -- you know, your involvement on this board is a testament to what City Council did when they originally set up the Downtown Investment Authority, looking for, you know, diverse backgrounds and experience and involvement in downtown -interest in downtown.

You know, I don't know what we would do without your accounting background. It's such an important part of our job in being fiscally responsible and keeping up. And we are fortunate that we've got a wonderful executive director who also has some of those same skills, but I -- from a board perspective, I will tell you, I thank you. Thank you for everything.

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THE CHAIRWOMAN: I agree. Thank you.

2 I've enjoyed so much working on the board

3 with you and getting to know you. And your

expertise in finance and in accounting and 4

budgeting has been immeasurable, so thank you

6 for your service. We're going to miss you.

And I see a big smile on your face today, 7 8 but we will miss you. And you may be called

into action, so don't go too far away, but 9

10 thank you for all you've done for the board and

11 for the City and the DIA.

So I'm going to call for a vote. We

didn't vote yet, did we? 13

I'm just going to say, all in favor of 14 Resolution 2022-12-06, please signify by saying 15

16 aye.

BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.

THE CHAIRWOMAN: Thank you, Mr. Froats.

Did you have any comments that you wanted 19

to make? 20

BOARD MEMBER FROATS: Sure.

22 THE CHAIRWOMAN: You might as well.

BOARD MEMBER FROATS: I'm just trying to

think, so I don't actually recall who was here 24

25 when I started. I know the board members that

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were here; that's Mr. Gibbs, Mr. Barakat, and

Braxton. As far as -- I know Mr. Sawyer was

here. And I don't remember if Ina -- no.

Mr. Parola was here, and --

But anyway, I appreciate everything the 5 6 staff has done. You know, being a board member and having a staff that we have on the DIA

makes it a lot easier, it really does. And we

really appreciate everything that you do. We 9 10 know that we are understaffed. We do know that

you guys work around the clock to get these 11

deals done, and there's been a lot that's

happened in the last four years. It's made 13 14

everything a lot busier.

We've gone from one meeting a month to committee meetings and then the regular meeting. Mr. Braxton initiated some PR stuff as well. All of that is needed, and there's just a lot of work that goes into this, so I appreciate everything that staff has done.

And I appreciate all the board members. We have two attorneys here, Mr. Gibbs and

23 Mr. Gillam. And I really appreciated them

keeping me in check guite a number of times. I 24 25

like that they know how -- the order to this

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and the procedures. I appreciate that.

2 Mr. Barakat, he's been here -- I think he's just a permanent fixture here because --

and we need him because of his expertise in the

real estate market, not just in downtown, but

all of Jacksonville, but -- really appreciate 6

7 that, so --

11

8 And to all the board members, it's a ton of work and I appreciate all the effort you put 9 into it, so thank you very much. 10

THE CHAIRWOMAN: Thank you.

12 Are there any other matters to be added to

the meeting before we move on? 13 14 MS. BOYER: No voting matters for the

15 board.

16 THE CHAIRWOMAN: All right. So no more 17 voting matters.

18 Then old business? Any new business? If not, we'll move on to your informational 19 20 briefing.

MS. BOYER: Thank you, Madam Chair.

22 Yes, we do have a CEO informational 23 briefing, and we have our construction update PowerPoint. We missed a couple of months, so 24

you're going to -- the briefing is going to 25

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have more on it than maybe you had before.

But, Ina, if you want to start with the PowerPoint, we'll start with the pictures.

So this is providing you just a few project updates of what has occurred in the last month.

So you will recall One Riverside, the former Times-Union building site. The developer, Fuqua, was to clear, demolish the building and clear the site of the future park and the location where the City is going to reroute McCoy's Creek.

What you see in these pictures are various stages of construction initially. And then, finally, a clean, graded site. So at the end, they have now finished their work on that and submitted their requests for the supplemental purchase price and have demonstrated substantial completion of the demolition project. So they're now --

And, by the way, on the residential side of that, construction has begun on the first phase of the residential, so I'm kind of jumping into my CEO report.

Next slide.

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So this is Home 2 Suites. This is the 1 hotel project. And as you can see,

particularly on -- the bottom left slide, I

3

think it's easier to see. You can see the 4

level of construction project -- progress that 5 is going on right now. 6

I think -- is the bottom right slide -- it might even be more further along, but it is a little harder to see because of the coloring,

but they're well underway in construction on that project. Next is Lift Ev'ry Voice and Sing Park. So Lift Ev'ry Voice and Sing Park, this is on

Lee Street, on the Emerald Trail. And the park itself has a lifted lawn on one end of the park and we'll have a shotgun house on the other, but you can see here that construction is well underway on the lifted lawn side, which will have a wall along where you see that framing, with signage on that side, a water feature on

19 20

21 that side, et cetera. So they're making

22 progress on construction here. 23

Next.

Emerald Trail Model Mile. So the Emerald 24 25 Trail Model Mile goes from the Rail Yard

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District, under I-95, comes across, through --

down to Lee Street, and follows Lee Street over

the Park Street viaduct. And you can see many

segments of it are already paved. And in some

cases, they are still doing work on it, but

this project is scheduled for completion in

March. So it's nearing that stage now, and you

8 can see substantial progress has been made. 9

Next.

10 Johnson Commons. I saw -- Billy is here, in the back. 11

12 So these are just some pictures showing the work, horizontal work that is underway on 13 the Johnson Commons townhome site. So 14 continuing to make progress on construction 15 there. 16

Next.

Our shotgun houses. You can see a lot of 18 19 the framing work has been done. Probably 20 50 percent complete or so. Mr. Parola went 21 over there yesterday.

I don't know if you can see -- it's really 22 23 hard to see.

Maybe, Ina, you can zoom in on that bottom right where you can see the porch. If you

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2 The framing on the porch and the porch roof is really pretty impressive and shows you

kind of what it's going to look like when they

finish them. But I think they're going to be much nicer than perhaps even we anticipated as 6

the work progresses. 7

Next.

The Federal Reserve building. So two of 9 our historic buildings -- the Federal Reserve 10 11 building, which is next to Sweet Pete's with 12 the lot in between, is really getting very close to completion. I expect that that 13 project -- that and the adjacent building 14 around the corner on Church Street will be 15 16 completed in the next 30 days.

And if you drive by during -- as I do in the mornings on the way to work, you can see lights on inside, you can see interior finishes already, floors, lighting hung. I mean, it -they're really looking great and are nearing completion. So I encourage you to walk around.

And you can see in the top left slide

here -- if you can zoom in on that -- the area 24 25 between Sweet Pete's and the Federal Reserve

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that was once parking is now going to become

that outdoor dining and outdoor event space. 2

3 And these are the canopy areas that have

already been constructed in that area. 4

5 Next.

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Performing Arts Center. So this is the Performing Arts Center on the riverfront, adjacent to Riverfront Plaza. And what you

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have here is a walkway that is being 9

10 constructed from the existing Davis Gallery

over to Coastline Drive East because the 11

circular turnaround -- once a fountain, now a 12

circular turnaround and parking area on the 13

14 riverfront -- is going to be reconstructed.

And that reconstruction is going to start very 15 16

soon. That contract is already awarded, 17 everything.

18

But in order to facilitate access to the Davis Gallery and the Performing Arts Center

from the rear, the first staging thing they're doing is constructing the sidewalk that will

21 provide access during the time that the road 22

23 itself is being reconstructed and a new access

to CSX is being created. And that expands the

park area and takes the parking off the

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riverfront. 1

Next.

Snyder. So we were walking by -- we were

having an office lunch yesterday and went to Bellwether. And as we were walking by and we

saw this construction going on on Snyder, I 6

said, "Oh, we need to take a picture of that," 7

8 because one of the things that's been on our

list for a very long time is to get the Snyder 9

10 disposition out on the street, but one of the

11 things that is holding this up in that effort

12 is there is a City Capital Improvement Project

to make a number of renovation improvements to 13

Synder. 14 15

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And, Mr. Parola, what did you tell me this was that had to do with water?

16 MR. PAROLA: Through the Chair to the CEO,

this is a water pump that they found they

needed for the fire suppression system to get 19

20 pressure.

> MS. BOYER: So this is one of those improvements to the building that will help us

22 23 market it. We will have it in a condition

where it is structurally stable and it has all

25 of its life safety features included and

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everything. 1

2 So somebody would have to finish out the

interior as they desired, but it would -- for

4 whatever use it was going to be, but we will

have all of the kind of essential functional 5 6 elements in the building before that happens.

And next.

8 VyStar parking garage, I'm sure many of you have seen is now occupied under a temporary 9

10 CO, and the exterior has been -- the whole

building is completed at this point, with the 11

exception of a few punch list items. And I 12

think it's a nice addition, from a parking 13

14 garage standpoint certainly.

Next.

Ashley Square is now leasing, so we're 16 17 including that. This will probably be the last time you see that one because they are now up 18 19 and running and leasing.

Four Seasons. So we included this just to show that the earthwork has begun. They have commenced horizontal, have their construction

23 fences up. We do have the agreement proceeding 24 through Council right now that has some

25 amendments to various terms, as you well know.

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However, work has begun on the site and is continuing.

3 Doro. Progress being made on Doro

Apartments. This was taken, I believe,

yesterday or the day before. Ina went down

there just to get the latest. You may see it 6

every time you go to an event in the sports 7

complex, but it's coming along and I think

we're on schedule with that. 9

10 Next is St. Johns River Park, Friendship 11 Fountain. So what you can see in the upper

left is -- I think we showed in the October 12

meeting some slides of how the fountain will 13

work functionally from a light and sound 14

standpoint, and then --15

16 This is actually the building that is the 17 pump house. The upper left shows you the kind

18 of gray building, which you can see on the bottom right is some of the issues they've had 19

with some of the exterior concrete 20

21 structurally.

22 So it has been entirely pressure-washed 23 and everything is being repaired to make sure

that the building is leak-proof and that all 24

the new equipment that's put in it will be 25

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secure and not damaged by any kind of rain or 2 water.

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RiversEdge. Construction work continues 4 on horizontal work at RiversEdge. And they 5 6 have submitted their park plans now for 7 ten-set, so we are -- I think there was a 8 meeting yesterday or the day before when they were discussing their first draw on upland 9 10 improvements. So we've had the draws on the bulkhead, but we will now be starting to 11 12 receive draw requests on the various upland infrastructure improvements. 13

And finally -- is this the last one, Ina? This is -- some of you saw last week the projection test on the Performing Arts Center building. So the static images you see on the left are the projection onto the facade of the Performing Arts Center building. And then the projection you see on the right is a test at Friendship Fountain, demonstrating the projection onto the mist.

So the team that is working on the actual cinema production and the choreography of the sound and light that are going to be projected,

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and the story, is well underway, but this was actually testing projector throws and distances

and all of the technical information that they 3

need to set it up properly. So it created 4 5

quite a stir of people stopping to watch when

they were catching it unexpectedly.

Any others?

MS. MEZINI: And just at the bottom right, we have the neighborhood banners going up. So Cathedral Hill has theirs going up, and then Brooklyn will be up coming next, City Center after that, and the Southbank after that. So in the coming month you'll see them --

MS. BOYER: Zoom in a little bit on the banners so they get to see.

So all of our street -- and that's in my update as well. All of our new street banners are going up downtown, and you'll have four of the districts up by early January.

MS. MEZINI: And we'll have better pictures next month. This one was taken a little bit far.

BOARD MEMBER GILLAM: The one picture, I didn't see it. I complained because I haven't seen the lighted artwork on the Water Street

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garage. It was almost (inaudible).

2 MS. BOYER: I know.

3 BOARD MEMBER GILLAM: I just texted you a

4 picture.

5 MS. BOYER: I saw the picture. I appreciate it. But what I don't know is 6 7 whether it's just a solid light or whether it's 8 changing like it's supposed to. Could you tell

when you saw it? 9

10 BOARD MEMBER GILLAM: I'll do a video next time. 11

MS. BOYER: Okay.

All right. In any event, Board Member Gillam has been asking me about the Water Street garage art that has not been working for a while. I had forwarded that request again to the Cultural Council, and they took a picture showing me that it now was turned on, but I'm not sure if it is changing and doing its full array of the light show. We'll see.

So, if I may, I'm going to go through the CEO report.

First of all, as to board members, I want to, on behalf of the staff, just express our gratitude to Mr. Froats because he really has Diane M. Tropia, Inc., Post Office Box 2375, Jacksonville, FL 32203

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been a champ. I know it's been hard for him to

attend committee meetings, once we started doing committee meetings. That's taxing on 3

everybody's schedule, but when we had 16 4

resolutions today, I think it really helped us

get through a board meeting to have addressed 6

them previously. And so I appreciate your 7

8 willingness to participate in that and always being there for quorums and helping us out. 9

10 And, most importantly, as everyone 11 mentioned, from a budget and finance 12 perspective, as we went through this City transition of accounting systems and were in 13 such a disrupted state for a couple of years, 14 your help was really invaluable on that, and 15 we're truly grateful for that. 16

We have -- George Saoud has been appointed as Mr. Froats' replacement and will begin to serve in January. So he will be on committees and at the board meeting in January.

21 And Jack Hanania has been nominated by the 22 Council president and his appointment is going 23 through City Council right now. He would not 24 be acted upon in time for January meetings but 25 could be for February meetings.

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And I have forwarded a couple other names to the administration for vacant appointments. 2 3 And if any of you know of other people who would like to serve -- Mr. Froats put us on to 4 Mr. Saoud, so he may have some other ideas too. 5 6 We'll take them.

> BOARD MEMBER FROATS: (Inaudible.) MS. BOYER: That should be a new rule.

So thank you to all of those who are serving today and continue to make our guorums here so important.

Budget. We have -- we will have a Budget and Finance Committee meeting in January, and we will have a resolution presented for the Northbank in February. The Southbank, they are still working on some reconciliations.

And the downtown maintenance project, that scope -- so this is through Public Works. You've seen Mr. Noel Famy at some of our meetings. He's managing that project. And what they were going to do is draft an RFP that has a menu, if you will, in it of enhanced services and then bid it out, and then we would be able to select what enhanced services we wanted to pay for downtown.

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So they're in the process of developing

that scope. It has now been forwarded to our office for review. So we'll review it, get

back to him after the first of the year. And, 4

hopefully, we'll get that out on the street in 5

the first quarter, but that probably means we 6

won't have those enhanced services in place

8 until at least March, maybe going into the

spring. That would certainly be our goal. 9

From a staffing standpoint, we still have four vacancies. We have extended an offer for the marketing position, but we have to go through a budget amendment with the Mayor's Budget Review Committee. We hope to do that the first part of January, and so we may be filling that position by mid-January.

We have a number of applicants who have applied for the administrative assistant position and have taken the test. And I don't have the information yet.

Two?

MR. PAROLA: Two passed.

MS. BOYER: Two passed the test, so we

will have two to interview. So that's a good 24 25 start at least. There we go.

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And we are scheduling one interview for 1 2 the property disposition position, but no new leads on the parking strategy.

And we have no office space addition or significant office improvements will be made until the mayoral election because the administration's thought was that there's no reason for us to move around or do anything like that when someone new is going to be organizing City Hall. So we'll just hold tight on that for a few months until we get to that point.

From a capital projects update standpoint, 13 14 DE-ZYN is the firm that's working on the waterfront show and did a projector test, and 15 they're moving right on schedule with their 16 17 work.

Agency Landscape & Design [sic] has developed an initial concept plan for Shipyards West, and we are scheduling a public meeting in late January or early February where we will be talking to the public about that, displaying 22 that concept plan and seeking comments and input, as well as the final plans for Riverfront Plaza and other parks.

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So this is kind of our general, here's where we are on riverfront parks, but it also gives us an opportunity on Shipyards West to show the first concept plan on that.

Hogan Street design was supposed to --Hogan Street was supposed to be -- this is an Emerald Trail segment -- was supposed to be under construction shortly after the first of the year. We're only at about 60 percent design. We expect to have those 60 percent design plans completed in January, and then Public Works is going to move to design-build because we just need to get the project moving and it's not where it needs to be from a timing standpoint.

Perkins & Will. There was a meeting this week regarding phasing of construction and development of the bid documents, but we're on schedule to have final design drawings and final bid documents for at least the first phase to be ready in January, and that will be bid in the spring.

23 The timing of construction and everything has been set so that we can still have Jax 24 25 River Jams in April. And Parks has asked if we

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could have the Jazz Fest in May. And then 2 hopefully we'll have the contract bid awarded, 3 have our prebid meeting and start construction the first of January. So as soon as we get 4 5 through those events, we'll be ready to pull 6 the trigger on construction.

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and Main.

We're dealing with a little bit of sequencing timing right now because we have a separate contractor doing the bulkhead work and we also have a separate firm doing the reconfiguration of Water Street and Independent Drive at the Hogan Street intersection, and we're just trying to figure out how we can perhaps accelerate the roadwork without interfering with the concerts so that the roadwork doesn't hold up the park work.

So good news, good problem to have, that we have three projects all going on at the same time and just trying to coordinate them.

The two-way conversion of Forsyth and Adams, we're at a hundred percent design. We had a meeting on it today about the bid, what we're calling "alternates," which are -- we bid this as a -- the simple version and the more elegant version. And the simple version is not

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really moving the curbs but just converting to two-way, which we knew we had enough money for.

3 And we still know we have enough money for that, more than enough, probably. 4

But we've also, then, incorporated a preliminary design on, well, what if we move the curbs and expanded the sidewalk area and provided the real shade and trees that we would like to provide in the area. And we have four sample blocks of that that we are also hoping to include in that as alternates and be able to include those.
